Take the plunge at Waterworld

Path to accessibility

A \$1.2 million upgrade by Tea Tree Gully Council has made Meadowvale Reserve an even better place to walk, run or cycle.

A new accessible footbridge across Dry Creek and concrete paths now provide easier access to Modbury Hospital, Tea Tree Plaza and the O-Bahn interchange from Meadowvale Road, Modbury.

Lighting and landscaping upgrades also occurred.

“The new bridge is a great improvement, but I especially like the lighting upgrade.

“I use the bus interchange to go to work and come through here when it’s dark. I feel much safer with the improvements,” said Modbury resident Raghu Palisetty.

A \$750,000 State Government Open Space Fund grant helped fund the upgrade, with the Council paying the remaining \$450,000.

A further \$900,000 in works are planned for the reserve in 2023, including creek restoration and rehabilitation work to slow water flow and prevent further erosion, plus mass plantings to stabilise creek banks.

Keep your recycling loose

If you’re putting your recycling in bags, your efforts are going to waste.

Place empty, clean recyclable items loosely into the yellow-lidded recycling bin, so they can easily be sorted and recycled.

Bagged recycling can’t be separated and sorted at the recycling facility due to time and safety constraints.

Also, plastic bags – along with strapping, hoses, string and rope – can jam recycling facility machinery, causing costly delays.

While plastic bags shouldn’t go in your yellow-lidded recycling bin, they can still be recycled.

You can drop them into a REDCycle recycling bins available at participating local supermarkets.

If you can’t drop plastic bags and other soft plastics off for recycling – or reuse them – plastic bags can be disposed of in your red-lidded landfill bin.

Time to prepare

If you live in a bushfire risk area in the City of Tea Tree Gully, danger could be on your doorstep in the months ahead.

The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System, launched in September this year, is your simplified survival tool.

It has four levels – moderate, high, extreme and catastrophic – and has been simplified from previous ratings used in South Australia.

It tells you how dangerous a fire would be if it broke out and what you need to do to stay safe each day.

Please take the time to get to know the new system and update your 5 Minute Bushfire Plan to give you and your family the best chance of survival.

Capital works update

We are continuing to roll out capital works that improve the things that matter to many of you.

Completed

Modbury Soccer Club (Ridgehaven)

New change rooms, bathroom and referee amenities, kiosk and tiered seating – \$1.79 million (includes \$671,000 from the State Government and \$75,000 from the club).

Underway

River Torrens Linear Park (Dernancourt and Highbury)

New public toilets – \$380,000 combined cost.

Golden Fields Reserve (Golden Grove)

New adventure playspace, toilet, car park, driveway and other improvements – \$1.5 million (includes \$750,000 from the State Government).

Lot 50 (Modbury Heights)

Transformation of undeveloped land into an open-space reserve, including landscaping and biodiversity plantings – \$570,000.

Still to come

Tilley Recreation Park (Surrey Downs)

New clubroom and change rooms, plus car park and sports field improvements – \$9.55 million (includes \$6.25 million from the State Government for this multi-year project).
