Draft Cats By-Law 2022 consultation

As you may be aware, Council has prepared a draft by-law for cats that is intended to assist with the management and control of cats within our Council area.

If the by-law is approved, it will require cat owners to:

- Register their cat(s) on the www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au website
- If they own or keep more than 2 cats, arrange a permit for additional pets (responsible pet owners will be able to keep more than 2 cats).
- Keep their cat(s) within property boundaries between 9pm and 7am.
- Ensure their cat is wearing a collar with identifying information if it leaves the owner's property.
- Ensure their cat is not an unreasonable nuisance on other people's premises through noise, odour, urination or defecation.

From 1 January 2024, cats would also need to stay within their owner's property boundary at all times unless they are under effective control (eg in a cat box or vehicle, or on a short leash).
