

# EXAMPLES OF SUCCESSFUL GRANT APPLICATIONS

The following are examples of successful grant applications.

### Category A – Community Development (max \$8,000)

**Dernancourt Community Garden – \$6,600** funding to upgrade the garden with nets to cover fruit trees, additional garden beds and a watering system to be more environmentally friendly and save water. These upgrades will assist the garden to expand their membership and offer more opportunity for involvement within the local community.

**Hope Valley Bowling & Community Club – \$4,850** funding to establish a junior development squad and a pennant team to provide a gateway for students from a wide range of backgrounds to play the game of lawn bowls at a local club regardless of age, gender or disability.

**Clovercrest Baptist Church – \$5,000** funding to further develop Quench Cafe into a community space and venue to build community and provide a place for locals (and youth) in Tea Tree Gully Council area to visit.

### Category B – Equipment (max \$3,000)

**Banksia Park Concert Band – \$3,000** funding to purchase sound and mixing system equipment.

**Roadrunners Softball Club – \$3,000** funding to purchase two safety nets, six batting tees, face shields and one outfield/pitching ball tossing machine.

**Off the Couch Art Studio Inc. – \$3,000** funding to purchase studio furniture and a printing press.

### Category C – Community Events (max \$2,500)

**Struthi Adelaide – \$1,500** funding for an Indian music and dance event to celebrate womanhood and Indian culture.

**SCOSA – \$1,000** funding to support the ‘Performability Talent Quest’ event for SCOSA clients to present a range of theatrical performances, plays, dance routines and singing.

**Wandana Primary School – \$1,370** funding to support Reconciliation Week celebrations performance by an Aboriginal community member who specialises in singing and acting that connects to culture and the school environment through activities such as weaving and silk printing.

### Category D – Community Environment (max \$2,000)

**Surrey Downs Community Children’s Centre – \$1,330** funding to establish a project to increase the learning for children and families around sustainability and growing their own foods and using worm farms to recycle waste and fertilise the garden.

**Our Lady of Hope School – \$1,500** funding to install separate recycling colour coded bins to encourage and educate students and families about landfill and the importance of recycling.

**Wynn Vale Community House Kindergarten – \$2,000** funding to install a rain water tank to water the garden and grow vegetables and teach children about being water wise and how to be responsible water users.
