Passing of Queen Elizabeth II

9th September 2022

Following the sad news of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II's death earlier this morning, the LGA has received advice through ALGA about appropriate protocols as a mark of mourning and respect.

The Australian Flag should be flown at half-mast immediately for the next 10 days.

Australian citizenship ceremonies should continue to take place and her portrait should continue to be displayed in line with the <u>Australian Citizenship Ceremonies Code</u>. Formal advice from the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet states that the Queen's portrait should continue to be displayed throughout a period of mourning.

There will be an official announcement in Parliament for when His Royal Highness, King Charles III will be announced as the new Monarch. Following this announcement further advice on future protocols (including the use of portraits of the new King) will be provided.

Councils will be updated on any other appropriate protocols and how local governments can mark observances of Her Majesty's passing.
