

Examples of successful grant applications

The following are examples of successful grant applications.

Category A – Community Development (max \$8,000)

Dernancourt Community Garden - \$6,107

Funding to establish a plant propagation nursery to grow seeds in a warm protected environment. The nursery supports garden members to participate in plant propagation from seed to harvest and offer more opportunity for involvement within the local community.

Tea Tree Studio - \$3,000

Funding to hold 40th anniversary workshops and an exhibition. The funding supported a series of workshops for community members and a public exhibition of the art produced from the workshops. The workshops provided an opportunity to learn skills and connect with others.

Clovercrest Baptist Church - \$5,000

Funding to further develop Quench Café into a community space and venue to building community and provide a place for locals (and youth) in Tea Tree Gully Council area to visit.

Category B – Equipment (max \$3,000)

Tea Tree Gully Quilters - \$3,000

Funding for materials to complete 50 quilts. The quilts were then gifted to Northern Adelaide Palliative Service at Modbury Hospital to support families experiencing loss and grief.

Pathway Community Centre - \$3,000

Funding for stainless steel trollies for a food rescue program. The program provides food for people that are doing it tough in the community.

Tea Tree Gully Table Tennis Club - \$1,640

Funding to purchase 2 table tennis tables to replace damaged ones.

Category C – Community Events (max \$2,500)

Chinese Music & Arts - \$2,500

Funding to hold 2 multicultural concerts in the City of Tea Tree Gully which features multicultural kids' music to inspire and celebrate international culture.

Wandana Primary School - \$1,000

Funding for a NAIDOC Week Celebration. An event was held at the School which was open to community and local Schools with various activities such as aboriginal art, music, cooking and performance.

Tea Tree Gully Gem and Mineral Club - \$1,350

Funding to hold the 2019 Biennial Tea Tree Gully Gem and Mineral Show. The show was held at a local School hall and was open to the community.

Category D – Community Environment (max \$2,000)

North East Hockey Club - \$642

Funding to support a waste diversion project. The Club purchased reusable table cloths, a 3-bin system and organics bin to reduce waste going to landfill.

Tea Tree Gully Tennis Club - \$1,622

Funding for an outdoor filtered water bottle refilling station. The water refill station supports the reduction of water bottle consumption and encourages bringing your own reusable bottle, reducing plastics into landfill.

Golden Grove Kindergarten - \$1,980

Funding for a rainwater tank which connects to a mud play kitchen. The students learn about rainwater harvesting and being waterwise, while reducing reliance on mains water.
